Variance reduction idea

$X \& Y$ are R.V.'s

goal: estimate $\mathbb{E}X$ using M.C. samples

Suppose: $\mathbb{E}Y$ is cheap to compute and Y is correlated with X

consider estimator

$$\alpha \in [0,1] \quad \theta_\alpha \stackrel{\Delta}{=} \alpha(X-Y) + \mathbb{E}Y \quad \text{to approximate } \mathbb{E}X$$

properties: $\mathbb{E}\theta_\alpha = \alpha \mathbb{E}X + (1-\alpha) \mathbb{E}Y \rightarrow \text{unbiased}$ (i.e. $\mathbb{E}\theta_\alpha = \mathbb{E}X$)
if $\leftarrow \mathbb{E}Y = \mathbb{E}X$ [not interesting]

$$\text{variance: } \text{Var}(\theta_\alpha) = \underbrace{\alpha^2}_{\alpha=1} [\text{Var}(X) + \text{Var}(Y) - 2\text{cov}(X,Y)]$$

Variance reduction?

for $\alpha=1$

$$\text{lunbiased setting) } \theta_\alpha = X + \underbrace{(\mathbb{E}Y - Y)}_{\text{correction}}$$

SGD setting:

X is $Df_t(x_t)$; $\mathbb{E}X = \text{batch gradient}$

SAG/SAGA algorithm: Y is g_i [past stored gradient]

$$\mathbb{E}Y = \frac{1}{n} \sum_i g_i$$

SAG alg.: $\alpha = \frac{1}{n}$ (biased)

SAGA alg.: $\alpha = 1$ (unbiased)

$$\text{SAG: } x_{t+1} = x_t - \gamma \left[\frac{1}{n} [Df_t(x_t) - g_{i_t}] + \frac{1}{n} \sum_j g_j \right] \quad (\text{biased})$$

$$\text{SAGA: } x_{t+1} = x_t - \gamma \left[Df_t(x_t) - g_{i_t} + \frac{1}{n} \sum_j g_j \right] \quad (\text{unbiased})$$

$$\text{SVRG: } x_{t+1} = x_t - \gamma \left[Df_t(x_t) - Df_t(x_{old}) + \frac{1}{n} \sum_j Df_j(x_{old}) \right] \quad (\text{unbiased})$$

(stochastic variance)

SVRG : $x_{t+1} = x_t - \gamma \left[\nabla f_{i_t}(x_t) - \nabla f_{i_t}(x_{old}) + \frac{1}{n} \sum_{j=1}^n \nabla f_j(x_{old}) \right]$ (unbiased)

(stochastic variance reduced gradient)

\downarrow

x_{old} is updated from outer loop

SVRG algorithm

```

for k=0, ... (outer loop)
    compute  $g_{ref} \triangleq \frac{1}{n} \sum_j \nabla f_j(x^{(k)})$ 
    for t=0, ..., Tmax
        sample  $i_t$ 
         $x_{t+1}^{(k)} = x_t^{(k)} - \gamma [\nabla f_{i_t}(x_t^{(k)}) - \nabla f_{i_t}(x^{(k)}) + g_{ref}]$ 
    end
     $x^{(k+1)} = x_{T_{max}}^{(k)}$ 
end

```

questions:

- what is T_{max}
- what is γ ?

original SVRG convergence result: need $\gamma \leq \frac{n-1}{L}$

$T_{max} \geq \frac{L}{\mu} = K$ → to run alg., need to know K ;
 \Rightarrow not adaptive to local strong convexity

tweak of SVRG (now called "loopless")
 [Hoffmann & al. NIPS 2015] $T_{max} \sim \text{Geom}(_)$

[at inner loop iteration, do a batch gradient comp with prob $\frac{1}{n}$]

then, get same convergence result as SAGA

→ size of inner loop $\mathbb{E}[T_{max}] = n$; overall cost of SVR $\approx 3 \cdot \frac{\text{SGD}_{\text{optimal}}}{n}$

SAG/SAGA replaces SVRG, convergence for convex fct. ($\mu=0$) get $\min \{ \mathbb{E}f(x_t) - f^* \} = O\left(\frac{1}{t}\right)$
 [contrast with $1/t$ for SGD]

CRF optimization

$$\max_{\vec{y}} \ell(\vec{y}) - \vec{w}^T \vec{q}_i(\vec{y})$$

CRF optimization

CRF objective :

$$\text{SVMstruct} \quad \min_w \frac{\lambda \|w\|^2}{2} + \frac{1}{n} \sum_{i=1}^n H_i(w)$$

$$\text{CRF} \quad \min_w \frac{\lambda \|w\|^2}{2} + \frac{1}{n} \sum_{i=1}^n -\log p(y^{(i)} | x^{(i)}, w) \log \left(\sum_{\tilde{y}} \exp(-w^T \psi_i(\tilde{y})) \right)$$

$$\max_{\tilde{y}} (l(\tilde{y}) - w^T \psi_i(\tilde{y}))$$

dual

$$\max_{\alpha_i \in \Delta_{|\mathcal{Y}|}} -\frac{\lambda}{2} \|w(\alpha)\|^2 + \frac{1}{n} \sum_{i=1}^n l_i^T \alpha_i$$

$$\max_{\alpha_i \in \Delta_{|\mathcal{Y}|}} -\frac{\lambda}{2} \|w(\alpha)\|^2 + \frac{1}{n} \sum_{i=1}^n H_i(\alpha_i) \stackrel{\text{entropy}}{\approx} \sum_{\tilde{y}} \alpha_i(\tilde{y}) \log p(\tilde{y})$$

$$\text{KKT} \rightarrow w(\alpha) = \frac{1}{n} \sum_i \sum_{\tilde{y}} \alpha_i(\tilde{y}) \psi_i(\tilde{y})$$

$$= \frac{1}{n} \sum_i \sum_{c \in C} \alpha_{i,c}(\tilde{y}_c) \psi_{i,c}(\tilde{y}_c)$$

from MRF

$$p(y|x; w) \propto \exp(w^T \psi(x, y))$$

* at optimality

$$\alpha_{i,c}^* = p(y|x^{(i)}; w(\alpha^*))$$

$\alpha_{i,c}^* \in \text{interior of } \Delta_{|\mathcal{Y}|}$

unlike sparse solution in structured SVM

CRF optimization:

- primal is smooth { strongly convex [vs. non-smooth for SVMstruct] }
 - for a while, batch L-BFGS was method of choice [batch \Rightarrow slow for larger n]
 - [Collins & D. JMLR 2008]: online exponentiated gradient (OEG)

block-coordinate method on dual; exponential gradient step on block

$$\alpha_i(\tilde{y})^{(t+1)} \leftarrow \alpha_i(\tilde{y})^{(t)} \exp(-\gamma_t \nabla_{\alpha_i} D(\alpha^{(t)}))$$

\rightarrow proximal gradient step using $kL(\alpha_i / \alpha_{i,t})$ as Bregman divergence

\hookrightarrow get linear conv. rate with cheap $O(1)$ updates (like SGD) [vs. $O(n)$ for batch method]

[can think of it as variance reduced method as well?]

- SAGA for CRF
[Schmidt et al. AISTATS 2015]

$$w^{(t+1)} = (1 - \gamma_t) w^{(t)} - \gamma_t \left[\nabla f_i(w^{(t)}) - g_i^{(t)} + \frac{1}{n} \sum_j g_j^{(t)} \right]$$

(t)

(t+1)

$\in [0, 1]$ (stability)
 \downarrow $\sim 1/n$

- SDCA
stochastic dual
coord. ascent

[note: BCFW is a
special case of SDCA
in S/MShMP alg. J?]

$$\alpha_{i,t}^{(t)}(\tilde{y}) = (1-\gamma_t)\alpha_{i,t}^{(t)}(\tilde{y}) + \gamma_t \tilde{s}_i^{(t)}(\tilde{y})$$

$\in [0, 1]$ (stabilize)

as a related fixed pt. update
 $\alpha_i^{*} = p(y|x_i; w(\alpha^{*}))$

$\Rightarrow \alpha(w)$

related to subgradient in
graph

$p(\tilde{y}|x_i; w(\alpha^{*}))$

$\alpha_{i,t}^{(t)}(\tilde{y})$

α_i^{*}

$\alpha(w)$

$\tilde{s}_i^{(t)}(\tilde{y})$

x_i

$w(\alpha^{*})$

α^{*}

$p(y|x_i; w(\alpha^{*}))$

proximal gradient method

↳ generalization of projected gradient method to other non-smooth fcts

composite framework: $F(w) \triangleq f(w) + \mathcal{L}(w)$ where f is convex & L-smooth
 \mathcal{L} is convex but not nec. smooth

• constrained opt. $\mathcal{L}(w) = S_M(w) \triangleq \begin{cases} 0 & \text{if } w \in M \\ +\infty & \text{otherwise} \end{cases}$

"indicator on M"

• L_1 -regularization $\mathcal{S}_M(w) = \|w\|_1$

proximal gradient update:

$$w_{t+1} = \underset{w}{\operatorname{argmin}} \quad f(w_t) + \langle \nabla f(w_t), w - w_t \rangle + \frac{1}{2\gamma_t} \|w - w_t\|^2 + \mathcal{L}(w)$$

$\triangleq P_t(w)$

• If $\gamma_t \leq \frac{1}{L}$ then $f(w) \in P_t(w)$ to w

• we can rewrite $P_t(w) = \frac{1}{2\gamma_t} \|w - [w_t - \gamma_t \nabla f(w_t)]\|^2 + \text{cst.}$ (by completing the square)

\Rightarrow if $\mathcal{L}(w) = S_M(w)$; we get the projected gradient alg.

$$w_{t+1} = \operatorname{Prox}_{\frac{\mathcal{L}}{\gamma_t}}(w_t - \gamma_t \nabla f(w_t))$$

$$w_{t+1} = \text{prox}_{\gamma_t}^{-1}(w_t - \gamma_t \nabla f(w_t))$$

↳ "proximal operator"

$$\text{prox}_{\gamma}^{-1}(z) \triangleq \arg \min_w \frac{1}{2} \|w - z\|_2^2$$

could replace with
Bregman divergence to get other
gener. (e.g. OEG)

* Like projection, prox operator is non-expansive (i.e. 1-Lipschitz)

$$\text{i.e. } \|\text{prox}_{\gamma}^{-1}(w) - \text{prox}_{\gamma}^{-1}(w')\|_2 \leq \|w - w'\|_2$$

\Rightarrow convergence rate of prox. grad. method on $F = f + \gamma g$
one same as unconst. gradient descent on f
